**Korean War Veterans to be Honored at the U.S. 25th Annual “Tiger” Wreath Ceremony and
United States Coast Guard Ring of Honor Tribute**

Pentagon Officer to Present Certificates to Korean War Veterans and Lay a Wreath at Sea

WHAT: The Department of Defense (DOD) 60th Anniversary of the Korean War Commemoration Committee will participate in a special program to commemorate the 69th Anniversary of the WWII Battle of Exercise Tiger at the Coast Guard Station Barnegat Light in Barnegat Light, New Jersey. This year, the Exercise Tiger Commemorative Foundation will have ceremonies at 20 U.S. Coast Guard Stations and a U.S. Cutter in the Arabian Gulf.

WHO: CWO Jay O. Greiner, Commander of USCG Station Barnegat Light and Susan Haines, National Executive Director U.S. Exercise Tiger Commemorative Foundation will participate in the program with other military officers and government officials. Colonel David J.
